# Garments of Salvation

The final days of Holy Week are called the triduum, from the evening of Maundy Thursday, through Easter Sunday. During these days we see our Lord lay aside his garments as he lays down his life for the sake of our salvation.



### Maundy Thursday

Gathered with his disciples to share the Passover meal, Jesus "laid aside his outer garments, and taking a towel, tied it around his waist" (John 13:4). The Master took on the role of a servant and washed his disciples' feet. He gave them, and us, a new command, "Just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another" (John 13:34).

### Holy Saturday

On that dark Friday when Jesus died, two of his followers, Joseph of Arimathea and Nicodemus, "took the body of Jesus and bound it in linen cloths with the spices, as is the burial custom of the Jews" (John 19:40). Wrapped not in the garments of a king, but in a linen burial shroud, the body of Jesus lay sealed in the tomb.


### Good Friday

Jesus was arrested and condemned to death. He was stripped of his garments and dressed in a scarlet robe and ridiculed as the King of the Jews. Then, dressed once again in his own clothing, Jesus was led out of the city to the site of execution. There he was stripped of his garments and nailed to the cross. "When the soldiers had crucified Jesus, they took his garments and divided them into four parts, one part for each soldier; also his tunic" (John 19:23). This was done to fulfill the Scriptures: "They divided my garments among them, and for my clothing they cast lots" (Psalm 22:18).

### Easter Sunday

Mary Magdalene went to the tomb early on Sunday morning and found Jesus' tomb open and empty! She ran to tell the disciples. Peter and John ran to the tomb to see for themselves what had happened. Peter looked into the tomb and "saw the linen cloths lying there, and the face cloth, which had been on Jesus' head, not lying with the linen cloths but folded up in a place by itself" (John 19:7). Jesus Christ had risen from the dead!

Baptized into Christ, we "put on Christ" (Galatians 3:27). Our crucified and risen Lord laid aside his garments so that we might be dressed in his righteousness and clothed for eternity in the garments of salvation: "I will greatly rejoice in the Lord; my soul shall exult in my God, for he has clothed me with the garments of salvation; he has covered me with the robe of righteousness" (Isaiah 61:10).

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




